

Inger Eckert, ACPC President, Chief Counsel Intellectual Property, International Paper

Ms. Inger Eckert is Chief Counsel, Intellectual Property for International Paper Company, a global leader in the paper and packaging industry with manufacturing locations in North America, Europe, Latin America, Asia and North Africa and net sales over \$23 billion in 2009. Her role encompasses leadership responsibility for the Intellectual Property Section of the Law Department as well as strategy development and execution with respect to International Paper's global intellectual property portfolio, including the acquisition, enforcement and licensing of the company's patents, trademarks, copyrights and trade secrets. Ms. Eckert serves on the leadership team of the Law Department and as legal advisor to the company's Technology organization.

Prior to joining International Paper in 2008, Ms. Eckert worked for Owens Corning, a \$5 billion (2007) global leader in building and composite materials, for over 12 years. Her Owens Corning career started as Intellectual Property Counsel for the Composites Systems Business and advanced to Director of Intellectual Property, a role she served in

for over 10 years. Before joining Owens Corning in 1995, Ms. Eckert was a product design engineer and intellectual property attorney at Ford Motor Company.

Ms. Eckert earned her Bachelor of Science degree in Electrical Engineering Technology from The Pennsylvania State University and her Juris Doctorate, *cum laude*, from the University of Dayton, School of Law.

Ms. Eckert, a registered patent attorney, is the current President for the Association of Corporate Patent Counsel, and is a member of the Michigan and Ohio state bars.



Steve Miller, Vice President & General Counsel Intellectual Property, P&G

Mr. Steve Miller joined P&G in August, 1984 after receiving a J.D. and a B.S. in Mechanical Engineering from The Ohio State University. In August 2000, Steve was appointed to his current position of Vice President & General Counsel-Intellectual Property for P&G. Steve has authored numerous P&G patents and patent applications and has been involved in a number of interferences, arbitrations, and litigation, both in the U.S. and abroad. Steve is a member of the American Intellectual Property Law Association; American Bar Association – Intellectual Property Committee; Cincy IP; Association of Corporate Patent Counsels; and on the Board of Directors for the Intellectual Property Owners Association. He is the President of the IPO Education Foundation; Past President of the IPO; a Steering Committee member of the 21st Century Coalition for Patent Reform; and was appointed by Secretary of Commerce Locke for a three year term on the Patent Public Advisory Committee.



Ken Adamo, Partner, Jones Day

Mr. Ken Adamo practices in the area of intellectual property law, including patent, trademark, copyright, unfair competition, trade secrets, trade dress, and related antitrust matters. He has extensive lead trial counsel experience in jury and nonjury matters before the state and federal courts and before the International Trade Commission, as well as *ex parte* and *inter partes* experience in the U.S. Patent and Trademark Office and with non-U.S. patent and trademark authorities. He also has appellate experience before the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit, having appeared in 35 appeals, most of which he has argued himself.

Mr. Adamo has written and lectured frequently on intellectual property law for both U.S. and non-U.S. publications and organizations. Topics he has addressed include U.S. permanent injunction/*eBay* practice, U.S. motion practice, U.S. discovery practice (including e-discovery), patent claim construction, *Festo*/doctrine of equivalents/prosecution history estoppel, motion practice, International Trade Commission proceedings, reexamination, fraud/inequitable conduct in procuring patents, artificial intelligence and business methods protection, reissue, means plus function

claim elements, combined-reference obviousness, cyberart, the best mode requirement, patent exhaustion, Internet jurisdiction, software patents, patent marking, transnational litigation and effects of non-U.S. adjudications, and trademark infringement. He also has written and lectured on a wide variety of trial, appellate and litigation issues, skills, and training topics.



Jason C. White, Partner, Howrey LLP

Mr. Jason White is a partner is Howrey's Chicago office. His practice has focused primarily on patent litigation matters, where he has represented many Fortune 500 companies as both plaintiffs and defendants in complex cases involving a wide array of technologies. Recently, a substantial portion of his practice has been devoted to representing companies accused of false patent marking under 35 U.S.C. § 292 by so-called *qui tam* plaintiffs. He is the co-chair of Howrey's False Patent Marking Task Force and has been involved in more than 10 false patent marking lawsuits. He also has significant experience representing both licensors and licensees in the negotiation of complex patent license agreements.



David Kappos, The Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the United States Patent and Trademark Office

Mr. David Kappos is the Under Secretary of Commerce for Intellectual Property and Director of the USPTO. In this role he advises the President, the Secretary of Commerce, and the Administration about intellectual property matters.

Over a 20-year career, Mr. Kappos has accrued deep knowledge of the patent system and broad respect from professionals across the field – including the biotech, life sciences and high tech sectors. Most recently, he was the vice president and assistant general counsel for intellectual property at IBM. Specifically, Mr. Kappos managed IBM's patent and trademark portfolios – protecting and licensing intellectual property worldwide.

He takes control of an office that provides incentives to encourage technological advancement and helps businesses protect their investments, promote their goods and safeguard against deception in the marketplace. The office continues to deal with a patent application backlog of more than 770,000, long waiting periods for patent review, information technology systems that are regarded as outdated and an application process in need of reform.

Recently, Mr. Kappos has served on the Board of Directors of the American Intellectual Property Law Association, the Intellectual Property Owners Association, and the International Intellectual Property Society. He also has been the Vice President of the Intellectual Property Owners Association. He has held various leadership positions in intellectual property law associations in Asia and the U.S. and has spoken widely in Asia, Europe and the U.S. on intellectual property topics.

Mr. Kappos received his bachelor's degree in electrical and computer engineering from the University of California-Davis in 1983, and his law degree from the University of California Berkeley in 1990. He joined IBM in 1983 as a development engineer and has served in a variety of roles before taking his current position, including intellectual property law attorney in IBM's Storage Division and Litigation group, IP Law Counsel in IBM's Software Group, assistant general counsel for IBM Asia/Pacific, IBM Corporate Counsel and assistant general counsel.



Wayne P. Sobon, Associate General Counsel, Director of Intellectual Property, Legal Group, Accenture

Mr. Wayne Sobon, Associate General Counsel, and Director of Intellectual Property for Accenture since 2000, is responsible for its global intellectual property program, including its patent program for capturing and protecting inventions worldwide. Currently Mr. Sobon is located in Accenture's San Jose, California office. Originally from Phoenix, Arizona, Mr. Sobon received his B.S. degree in physics and B.A. degree in German Studies from Stanford University in 1984 and his J.D. and M.B.A. from the University of California, Berkeley in 1992. Since receiving his law and business degrees, Mr. Sobon worked at several Silicon Valley law firms, most recently Gray Cary Ware & Freidenrich LLP, where he was a partner specializing in patent prosecution, litigation and general intellectual property counseling.

Mr. Sobon is a frequent speaker and lecturer on intellectual property issues and is a member of the boards of the Intellectual Property Owners Association (IPO), and the board of Invent Now.org of the National Inventor Hall of Fame, and a prior member of the board of the American Intellectual Property Law Association (AIPLA).



Patricia Bornes, Senior Director & Legal Counsel, Intellectual Property & Licensing Group, Microsoft Corporation

Ms. Patricia Bornes is a senior corporate attorney in Microsoft Corporation's Intellectual Property & Licensing Group. In her 13+ years with Microsoft, she has provided IP-related legal counsel to numerous business groups around the world. Since 2007, Patricia has been located in Raleigh, NC, where she supports Microsoft's patent licensing programs and manages the legal support for the Interoperability Solutions Team, a worldwide group of sales and marketing executives that manage Microsoft's interoperability alliance with Novell.

From 2004-2007, Ms. Bornes lived in London and was general counsel for Microsoft Research Ltd in Cambridge and intellectual property counsel to Microsoft R&D personnel in Europe and the Middle East. She was responsible for negotiating development and collaboration agreements with academic and industry partners, acting as liaison with the European Patent Office, and providing oversight on the development and maintenance of Microsoft's patent portfolio. Prior to 2004, Ms. Bornes was lead patent counsel for various product groups within Microsoft, including MSN and other online verticals, SQL Server, Visual Studio, and Microsoft Dynamics, at its corporate headquarters in Redmond, WA.

Before joining Microsoft, Ms. Bornes prepared and prosecuted software patent applications as an associate with Seed Intellectual Property Law Group, a boutique IP law firm in Seattle, WA.

Ms. Bornes has an undergraduate degree in Computer Science from the University of South Florida and a J.D. from the Florida State University. She is a registered patent attorney, a member of the Washington Bar and is active with the North Carolina Bar Association. She co-chairs the NCBA IP Licensing Committee and is an Executive Board member of the North Carolina Technology Association.



Andrew L. Schaeffer, Corporate Counsel & IP Leader – Electronics & Communications Technology, DuPont

Mr. Andrew Schaeffer is currently Corporate Counsel & IP Leader for Electronics and Communications Technology where he manages a group of patent attorneys and other professionals.

Between 2007 and 2009, he was Managing Counsel – Operations and Partnering in DuPont where he was responsible for all facets of DuPont Legal's partnering program, including law firm and vendor selection, firm performance evaluation, internal and external case assignment, rate negotiations and matter conflict resolution. His operational responsibilities included litigation budget management, supervising DuPont Legal's e-discovery team, overseeing legal technology initiatives, and briefing DuPont's outside auditors and Company management on litigation matters to facilitate compliance with Sarbanes-Oxley. During that time period, he also co-edited the 5th

edition of the DuPont Legal Model Book entitled "The New Reality: Turning Risk into Opportunity through the DuPont Legal Model".

Between 2003 and 2007, Mr. Schaeffer was the Intellectual Property Litigation Group Leader primarily responsible for managing DuPont's patent litigation. Between 1990 and 2003, he served as patent litigation and/or prosecution counsel for several DuPont business units as well as Central Research & Development.

Prior to joining DuPont in 1990, Mr. Schaeffer practiced as an associate at the IP firm of Seidel, Gonda, Lavorgna & Monaco in Philadelphia, PA (1987-1990). There he worked on a variety of patent litigation, prosecution and opinion matters.

Mr. Schaeffer received his undergraduate degree from Lehigh University in Chemical Engineering in 1982. He obtained her J.D. from the Delaware Law School of Widener University in 1987.

James Pooley, Deputy Director General, Innovation & Technology, WIPO

Mr. James Pooley is the Deputy Director General for Innovation and Technology at the World Intellectual Property Organization in Geneva. WIPO is one of the specialized agencies of the United Nations, and Mr. Pooley is responsible for overseeing operation of the international patent system, as well as programs directed at the development of patent laws.

Before coming to WIPO, Mr. Pooley was a senior partner in Morrison & Foerster, where he represented clients in patent, copyright and trade secret litigation. He has also served as an adjunct professor of law at the University of California, Berkeley, as President of the American Intellectual Property Law Association and of the National Inventors Hall of Fame, and as a member of the National Academies of Science Committee on IP Rights. Mr. Pooley is an author of several major works in the IP field, including his treatise *Trade Secrets* (Law Journal Press) and the *Patent Case Management Judicial Guide* (Federal Judicial Center).

Mr. Pooley graduated from Columbia University Law School as a Harlan Fiske Stone Scholar in 1973, and holds a Bachelor of Arts, with honors, from Lafayette College.



Tara D. Elliott, Patent Litigator, Fish & Richardson

Ms. Tara Elliott is an attorney in the Delaware office of Fish & Richardson P.C. Her practice focuses on intellectual property litigation involving a range of technologies, including electrical and computer engineering. Ms. Elliott has technical experience as an Analyst and Computer Engineer at the Central Intelligence Agency (CIA). She is a member of the firm's IP Risk Management Group (RISC/return) and is actively involved in Fish & Richardson's Diversity Committee and its initiatives.

Ms. Elliott advises clients in litigation strategy, IP portfolio strategy, e-commerce, information security, and the protection of trade secrets. She has consistently played key roles in significant cases, including having assumed substantial responsibility on behalf of a Fortune 100 company in high-stakes patent litigation, where she coordinated and supervised the work of her team, took and defended fact and expert depositions, drafted summary judgment briefs, and developed high-level strategy on the merits of the complex case, which ultimately settled favorably for the client. Ms. Elliott has handled these responsibilities in other cases as well, wherein she has also argued motions in

court and negotiated settlements out-of-court. She not only capably advises and represents her clients—including Netcraft Corporation, Golden State Foods, ING Direct, Microsoft Corporation, and Bentley Systems—but also counsels her colleagues in various matters of litigation strategy and trade secret protection.

After several years in private practice, Ms. Elliott left Fish & Richardson in 2006 to clerk for the Honorable Gregory M. Sleet, Chief Judge, in the United States District Court for the District of Delaware. After a year with Chief Judge Sleet, Ms. Elliott spent a year clerking for the Honorable Raymond C. Clevenger, III, on the Federal Circuit Court of Appeals. While at the Federal Circuit, she also assisted the Honorable Arthur Gajarsa and the Honorable Sharon Prost on selected cases. In 2008, Ms. Elliott rejoined Fish & Richardson's Delaware office.

Ms. Elliott currently is a member of the Criminal Justice Act (CJA) Panel, which consists of private attorneys who accept appointed criminal cases from the District Court. In this capacity, she assists the Office of the Public Defender for the District of Delaware in preparing for and defending cases through trial. She has served as CLE faculty on the topics of "Joint Infringement and "Document Retention and Destruction," and has co-written articles on Internet commerce and trade secrets. She is an executive committee member of the Delaware chapter of the Federal Bar Association, a member of the Delaware State Bar Association's Multicultural Judges & Lawyers Section, and serves on the Board of East Side Charter School in Wilmington, Delaware. In 2009, Ms. Elliott was selected to attend the "FORTUNE Most Powerful Women Evening With..." Dinner at the U.S. State Department as a "rising star."

Ms. Elliott graduated with a degree in Computer Engineering from Georgia Institute of Technology (Georgia Tech), which she attended on both academic and athletic scholarships. She attended law school at the University of Pennsylvania, where she participated in various activities, including the Moot Court Board, the Journal of Constitutional Law, and the National Trial Team. She served on the Law School's Admissions Committee and was a research assistant to Professor R. Polk Wagner. While in law school, she was admitted to the Patent Bar, honored with the American Intellectual Property Law Education Foundation (AIPLEF) - Sydney B. Williams, Jr. Award, and honored with the 3L Leadership Award by her peers.

Honorable Kimberly A. Moore, Circuit Judge, CAFC

Hon. Kimberly Moore was appointed by President George W. Bush in 2006. Prior to her appointment, Judge Moore was a Professor of Law from 2004-2006 and Associate Professor of Law from 2000-2004 at the George Mason University School of Law. She was an Assistant Professor of Law from 1997-1999 and the Associate Director of the Intellectual Property Law Program from 1998-1999 at the Chicago-Kent College of Law. Judge Moore clerked from 1995-1997 for the Hon. Glenn L. Archer, Jr., Chief Judge of the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit and was an Associate at Kirkland & Ellis from 1994-1995. From 1988-1992, Judge Moore was employed in electrical engineering with the Naval Surface Warfare Center. Judge Moore received her B.S.E.E. in 1990, M.S. in 1991, both from the Massachusetts Institute of Technology and her J.D. (cum laude) from the Georgetown University Law Center in 1994. Judge Moore has written and presented widely on patent litigation. She co-authored a legal

casebook entitled Patent Litigation and Strategy and served as the Editor of The Federal Circuit Bar Journal from 1998-2006.



Honorable Gregory M. Sleet, Chief Judge, District Court of Delaware

Hon. Gregory Sleet, a native of New York City, is a graduate of Hampton University, Hampton, Virginia and Rutgers University School of Law at Camden, New Jersey, where he was an Earl Warren Legal Scholar. He received his Juris Doctorate in 1976.

Judge Sleet has had a varied professional experience in the law consisting primarily of civil and criminal litigation and corporate legal work. From 1992-1994, he served as in-house counsel in the legal department of Hercules Incorporated. Prior to that, he was a Deputy Attorney General for the State of Delaware and, prior to that, practiced law in Philadelphia, Pennsylvania for fourteen years -- six of those as an assistant public defender with the Defender Association of Philadelphia.

At age 43, Judge Sleet took the oath of office on Monday, June 13, 1994, to become the first African-American U.S.

Attorney for the District of Delaware. In January of 1995, he was appointed by United States Attorney General Janet Reno to the Attorney General's Advisory Committee for a two-year term. The AGAC is a group (numbering about 17 U.S. Attorneys at that time) that meets regularly in Washington, D.C. to assist and advise the Attorney General in setting policy and strategic direction for the U.S. Department of Justice. On August 4th of 1995, Ms. Reno further honored U.S. Attorney Sleet by naming him the Vice Chair of the Committee for the 1995-96 session. Additionally, Judge Sleet is the 1994 Distinguished Service Award recipient of the National Association for the Advancement of Colored People, Central Delaware Branch. In 1998, *Delaware Today* magazine selected him as Delawarean of the Year. In 2000, Judge Sleet was named one of "Fifty of the Finest" graduates in the first fifty years of Rutgers University - Camden Division.

Judge Sleet currently holds an adjunct teaching position at Rutgers University School of Law and at Widener University School of Law, where he teaches courses in patent litigation. He is also a Member of the District Court Advisory Committee, Member of the District Court Technology Committee, Member of the Board of Overseers of the Widener University School of Law, Member of the Third Circuit Judicial Council IT Committee, Member of the Third Circuit Judicial Council Facilities and Security Committee, and Member of the Third Circuit Committee on Criminal Pattern Jury Instructions.

On April 27, 1998, Judge Sleet was confirmed by the United States Senate to the United States District Court for the District of Delaware. He was sworn-in as the first African American to become a Judge of that Court on September 28, 1998, and became Chief Judge on July 1, 2007.

Honorable Elizabeth D. Laporte, Magistrate Judge, Northern District of California

Hon. Elizabeth Laporte is a United States Magistrate Judge for the Northern District of California. Appointed on April 4, 1998, Judge Laporte presides over numerous civil cases randomly assigned to her with the parties' consent, ncluding patent, trademark, copyright and other business litigation, employment, civil rights and environmental cases. She also presides over criminal matters, conducts settlement conferences, and resolves discovery disputes.

Judge Laporte is the author of Managing the Runaway Patent Case, an article published in the Summer 2003 issue of the *Northern California ABTL [Association of Business Trial Lawyers] Report*, and Getting the Most Out of Judicial Settlement Conferences, published in the Winter 2006 issue. Lisa Jorgenson, Group Vice President, IP & Licensing, STMicroelectronics



Honorable Paul R. Michel, Chief Judge, CAFC (Retired)

Hon. Paul Michel was appointed to the United States Court of Appeals for the Federal Circuit in March of 1988. On December 25, 2004, he assumed the duties of Chief Judge. Since his elevation in 2004 to Chief Judge, he has served as one of 27 judges comprising the Judicial Conference of the United States, the governing body of the Judicial Branch. In 2005 he was appointed by the Chief Justice of the United States to serve on the seven-judge Executive Committee of the Judicial Conference.

Chief Judge Michel has written over 800 opinions in the diverse legal areas covered by his circuit: patent, government contracts, international trade, veterans' benefits, government takings of private property, tax, childhood vaccine injuries, military promotions, trademark, civilian government personnel, and whistleblower cases. By designation of the Chief Justice, he has also regularly sat with the Second, Third and Ninth Circuits, where he decided constitutional, the promotions are and the second.

criminal, administrative, securities, immigration and state law cases.

Prior to his appointment, Chief Judge Michel served in the executive and legislative branches of the government for 22 years. Following graduation from Williams College in 1963 and the University of Virginia Law School in 1966, Michel served as Assistant District Attorney and then Deputy District Attorney for Investigations under Arlen Specter in Philadelphia, where he was responsible for investigating police and public corruption. As Assistant Special Watergate Prosecutor in 1974-1975 under Leon Jaworski, he was responsible for investigating President Nixon's slush fund, Howard Hughes, Bebe Rebozo, and Nixon's secretary, Rosemary Woods. From 1975 to 1976 he was an assistant counsel for the Senate Select Committee on Intelligence (Church Committee), assisting Chief Counsel Frederick AO Schwarz in investigating abuses of civil liberties by U.S. law enforcement and intelligence agencies targeting American citizens. Michel also helped draft legislation to ensure that NSA, CIA, and IRS practices conformed to the Constitution and statutes. From 1976-1978, he served under Dick Thornburgh as Deputy Chief of the Justice Department's new Public Integrity Section, where he directed the "Koreagate" investigation. In 1978 he was appointed by Benjamin Civiletti as an Associate Deputy Attorney General, helping to supervise U.S. Attorneys, the Criminal Division, the FBI, and the Marshals Service. He was one of the authors of the legislative charter proposed in 1978 for the FBI and of revisions to Attorney General's Guidelines authorizing and constraining certain FBI investigative practices. In 1980 he briefly served as Acting Deputy Attorney General. From April 1981 until March of 1988, he served on Senator Arlen Specter's staff, including as Counsel and Chief of Staff. There, he worked on legislation dealing with career criminals, arms control, gun control, mining safety, nuclear arms summit meetings and many other subjects.

In 2008 Chief Judge Michel was awarded the first annual Lifetime Achievement Award by the Richard Linn American Inn of Court in Chicago for "Dedication to Justice for All," the Sedona Conference Lifetime Achievement Award for "Contributions to Intellectual Property Law," the first award for "Outstanding Achievement in the Area of Intellectual Property Law" of the Philadelphia Intellectual Property Law Association, and the annual Judicial Honoree Award of the Bar Association of the District of Columbia. In 2009 he was given the Intellectual Property Person of the Year Award by the Los Angeles Intellectual Property Association and the Los Angeles Intellectual Property Inn was renamed the Paul R. Michel Intellectual Property Inn. In 2010, he was given the Connor Inn Excellence Award, and was selected to be inducted into *Intellectual Asset Management (IAM) Magazine's* Intellectual Property Hall of Fame.

Chief Judge Michel was a founding member of the George Washington Inn of Court, and a founder, and, in 2003 president, of the Edward Coke Appellate Inn of Court.
